## Therefore...

- 1. Jesus ends the single greatest collective teaching in history by giving 3 warnings:
  - a. Two types of GATES
  - b. Two types of TEACHERS
  - c. Two types of BUILDERS

#### The Wise Builder

Matthew 7:24 | Luke 6:48a

- 2. He digs DEEP to find a solid foundation
- 3. He looks FORWARD and builds for the future

#### The Foolish Builder

Matthew 7:26 | Luke 6:49

- 4. He doesn't DIG, he just BUILDS
- 5. He wanted his house QUICK and with little EFFORT

#### The Storm Comes

Matthew 7:25,27

- 6. Both builders endure the SAME storm
- 7. It's not a matter of IF, but WHEN

# **Building Inspection**

- 8. The WISE and the FOOLISH both go through the flood
- 9. His way does not lead you OUT but THROUGH hardship

# **Life Group Questions**

- In this last warning from our study, Jesus speaks into a current conversation of His day. A
  truthful, thoughtful vision of life based on reality, and another view to go the easy, quick, cheap
  route. Discuss the relevance of this topic in our culture (in and outside the church!).
- 2) The wise man builds the house of his life on the bedrock of practicing Jesus' teachings that we've looked at over these past few months. Go over the series and discuss which lessons impacted you the most.
- 3) Looking back over your notes from this week's sermon, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, confused you or challenged you?

#### DIGGING DEEPER

- 4) Is it important that Jesus doesn't tell us why the foolish man doesn't build on a good foundation? Does it help us find our 'place' in this teaching? Discuss where you find yourself on the spectrum from "Wise to Foolish" builder and the challenges to practice His teachings.
- 5) Both builders experience the same storm. It's not a matter of 'if' but 'when' the storm comes. Jesus says to you and I that life is hard whether you follow Him or not. Read these passages to encourage you through your storms and find comfort from the fellowship we are privileged to have!
